

Barcode readers help speed things up for eTicket users

Southern has installed more barcode readers at its stations to help passengers using smartphone eTickets.

The additional readers mean there's now 100% coverage at ticket gates, cutting queues at Angmering, Ashtead, Barnham, Bexhill, Bognor Regis, Dorking, East Grinstead, Haywards Heath, Lancing, Leatherhead, Littlehampton, Polegate and Reigate.

Southern says about 50% of tickets sold in the UK are digital.
