Overnight trains will run from London as far as the East Midlands after the Queen's funeral next Monday.

An article in news says rail services are being ramped up for the expected influx of visitors into the capital who want to pay their respects.

Transport bosses have warned that London will experience "unprecedented travel demand" in the coming days because of the Queen's lying-in-state and funeral and have confirmed that a "very limited" number of trains will run through the night.

The Department for Transport (DfT) will be able to share the outcome of revised proposals for a new East Coast main line (ECML) timetable upgrade planned for 2023 later this year.

Parliamentary under-secretary of state for transport, Robert Courts, told Kenny MacAskill, MP for East Lothian, in a Commons written reply on 8 September that a public consultation on the proposed major timetable change on the ECML, received more than 9,000 responses and invaluable feedback and insight from local communities.
