A one-minute silence will be held in railway stations across Britain on Wednesday in honour of the three people who died in the Stonehaven train crash.

The news features in the Herald that stations across Scotland, along with many in England and Wales, will fall silent at 9.43am on Wednesday to commemorate the week that has passed since the fatal derailment was reported.

Driver Brett McCullough, 45, conductor Donald Dinnie, 58, and passenger Christopher Stuchbury, 62, were killed when the Aberdeen to Glasgow train crashed into a landslide across the tracks following torrential



rain.
