Lumo, FirstGroup's new 100 per cent electric, affordable rail service, will travel from London King's Cross to Edinburgh for the first time today (21 October) as it celebrates its inaugural service.

Early ticket sales data suggest reaction to Lumo's greener and affordable offering has been positive.

With the first passenger services beginning on Monday (25th October), Lumo says sales are above



expectations, despite selling tickets for just 44 days.

Heavy rain and strong winds overnight have led to flooding of homes and businesses, and the closure of roads and rail lines across the South East.

No trains are running between Crowborough and Uckfield, and through Greenhithe following landslides.
