

The latest rail news on Thursday, 22nd July 2021

The railway through Troon station is set to reopen tomorrow.

Trains have been unable to pass through the station since a serious fire badly damaged station buildings last Saturday.

No train services will stop at Troon, where engineers are continuing their work to make the building safe.



Updates on the reintroduction of services to the station will be made as those recovery works progress.

Avanti West Coast has kicked-off the UK's biggest ever train fleet upgrade this week, as the first Pendolino was taken out of service for work to begin on the £117 million project.

The programme will transform all 56 of Avanti West Coast's iconic Pendolinos. The trains have clocked up more than 270 million miles since they were launched – enough to go to the moon and back more than 500 times.

The Pendolinos have served routes between London, Birmingham, Manchester, Liverpool, Glasgow, and Edinburgh for close to 20 years and the upgrade will return the whole Pendolino fleet to an 'as new' condition.
