The Conwy Valley Line in north Wales will reopen on September 28th after Network Rail's £2.2 million investment to better protect the railway from extreme weather and flooding.

The line has washed away because of flooding twice in the past two years, which has meant lengthy closures for passengers and local communities while the railway has been repaired.

The work has involved the installation of 16,000 tonnes of rock armour alongside almost 2km of railway.
