Christmas travellers should consider avoiding trains due to engineering work and social distancing restrictions, Transport Secretary Grant Shapps has said.

The article in the Daily Mail says ministers are expected to announce later this week how virus restrictions will be eased to let families spend the festive period together.

But with major work across Britain's railways and capacity constraints to allow distancing, Mr Shapps urged people to 'look very carefully at the transport route they take' when planning Christmas trips.

The Railway Industry Association has called for the Government to consider the long-term importance of the rail network.

It has published 10 reasons why rail investment should continue, ahead of the Spending Review and in light of the debate over coronavirus's impact on the future of transport.

The reasons set out the case for how the railways can play a pivotal role in the UK's economic recovery.
