The RSSB has published results from the first-ever mental health survey of the rail industry, with almost half of respondents found to have a mental health condition.

The survey found nearly half (43%) of almost 4,000 respondents were found to have met criteria for a clinical mental health condition across screen measures for depression, anxiety and post-traumatic stress disorders.



Dr Michelle O'Sullivan, RSSB's clinical psychologist, said: "This research identifies key modifiable work factors that can ensure the rail industry is a great place to work."

The Built Environment Committee has today written to the Rail Minister calling for the Government to set out a strategy for rail fare reform to ensure that Great British Railways (GBR) is clear about its objectives and can successfully implement the new system.
