The cost of completing Crossrail exceeds available funding, the government spending watchdog has found.

An article on the BBC website says the National Audit Office estimates the cost of the new rail link will be between £30 million and £218 million above the current funding.

Transport for London said there had been "many challenges", but the line would be opened "as soon as possible".



HS2 Ltd has announced that Kier Construction Limited will be appointed to deliver a major programme of highways and utility work on Phase 2a of the project, which will take the UK's new high speed railway north of the West Midlands.

Phase 2a will carry trains bound for destinations such as Glasgow, Liverpool, Manchester and the north west, speeding up overall end-to-end journey times and freeing up space on the existing network.
