

Marking 160 years of Harrogate railway

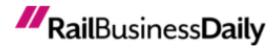
A special exhibition at one of Northern's stations has celebrated how the railway transformed the quiet spa of Harrogate 160 years ago into a bustling tourist town.

Organised by the Harrogate Civic Society, with support from LNER, Northern, Network Rail and the Harrogate Model Railway Group, the display on the concourse told the story of Harrogate station and the history of its surrounding railways.

The exhibition was open to the public last weekend (July 30th & 31) before an event was held today (Monday, 1 August) with dignitaries from the community and across the railway to mark the exact date the station opened.

Tony Baxter, regional director at Northern said: "It has been great to celebrate this landmark date in the town's history.
