Conservative MP for Harrow East, Bob Blackman, has visited Alstom's Willesden Depot to learn about the invaluable work that goes on there for his local community, as well as to meet some of the railway workers who keep London's transport system running.

Blackman was introduced to representatives from Alstom and Railway Industry Association and was taken on a guided tour of the site. The London Overground, serving Blackman's constituents in Harrow, is maintained on site at Willesden – a significant employer of rail workers in Blackman's region of north-west London. Blackman was able to meet a number of these workers on site and witness the work going on to keep this vital London line running.

So, it is more important than ever that policy makers understand the work the rail supply sector does to support the network, getting a hands-on experience of railway work. The pipeline of interest for the programme in 2022 is already strong, and it continues to go from strength to strength.
