## New Under Secretary of State in the Department for Transport appointed

Wendy Morton has been appointed to be a parliamentary under secretary of state in the Department for Transport.

The move took place as Chris Heaton-Harris was chosen to be minister for Europe — he will deputise for the foreign secretary as necessary on EU Exit and the Protocol.

Both changes were triggered over the weekend following the departure of Lord Frost from his role as Brexit minister.
