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Nuclear Transport Solutions (NTS) has offered ambitious employees the chance to study for a management qualification, gaining the skills they need to lead teams successfully.

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These workshops will be supported by coursework, presentations and discussions, with students encouraged to build on their knowledge and skills.

Upon completion, they will be entitled to membership of professional body The Institute of Leadership and Management.

Commenting on the qualification, NTS recruitment lead Alex Webster said: "Our people make us unique, and this programme is just one of the ways we're investing in them. We look forward to seeing the first cohort of students gain new skills and grow in confidence over the coming months."
