

## Siemens Mobility welcomes shadow rail minister

Shadow Rail Minister Tan Dhesi MP has visited Siemens Mobility's facility in Chippenham — which helped to deliver the new Elizabeth line for his constituents.

Siemens Mobility's Chippenham site played an essential role in the Elizabeth line project, bringing together suppliers to plan and deliver the railway's signalling system, with the company's site in Ashby, Leicestershire delivering the station and railway control.

During the visit, Dhesi drove an Elizabeth line train in an in-cabin simulator, spoke to apprentices working onsite, and explored the Customer Experience Suite, which captures the different elements of the passenger journey in action.
