Transport for Wales are offering opportunities for small and medium businesses in Wales to be part of the investment project that will transform the transport sector.

Starting in January, Business Wales will be running free workshops at different locations throughout the country, helping provide guidance for Small Medium Enterprises (SMEs). The workshops will focus on Human Resources and Sustainability and SMEs will be given the opportunity to look at these requirements in greater detail and provided with advice; improving their chances of winning

The 'HR Essentials' workshop will provide a background to the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act to help SMEs respond to tender Pre-Qualification Questions on the Code of Practice on Ethical Employment in Supply Chains. The 'Sustainability Essentials' workshop will be centralised around sustainability issues including minimising waste, forest stewardship and decarbonisation.

Howard Jacobson, Tendering Adviser at Business Wales, said: "Business Wales have a plan in place to advise and help businesses all over Wales to become 'Fit for Tender' and be able to take advantage of this exciting opportunity over the next 15 years.
