The body responsible for helping millions — from rail operators to staff and passengers — says it would like for people to join who are aged 13 to 17.

The groups will help British Transport Police learn how its work affects younger people and also enable it to gather important insight as to how it can improve its service.

It doesn't matter what your background is, if you are 13 to 17, British Transport Police wants to hear your views.

Taking part is easy; participants can join in from the comfort of their own homes using Microsoft Teams, or they can join the groups in person. Participation is for a few hours, four times a year.
